On behalf of the Board of Directors, Officers and members of Reddington Rock Riding Club, we are pleased you have chosen to join. We hope this "New Member Welcome Kit" will help you become familiar with the club.

The purpose of the club is to encourage and promote the sport of trail riding by the following and any other methods deemed advisable:

- The holding of trail rides and horse related functions in a safe family-oriented environment
- Maintaining bridle trails in the area
- To sponsor functions pertaining to equine activities, including equine camping, trail riding, training and educational events and all-around general horsemanship

Our club was organized in 1962 as a family-oriented organization to encourage and promote the sport of trail riding.

The members of RRRC own and manage our property near Soapstone Mountain, just over the Somers town line into Stafford Springs, Connecticut. It covers approximately 18 acres and backs up to the Shenipsit State Forest, where trails abound. The grounds include a large mowed grass field and a beautiful wooded area with 34 campsites.

Our facilities include a pavilion with stone fireplace that can house up to 80 people. There is a kitchen structure; a riding ring; round pen; small stall barn; and flush toilets.

Our season of organized events usually runs from mid-April to November 30. Scheduled events usually include various meals and activities, and a trail ride. You may join a group ride, led by one of our trail bosses, or go your own way with a few friends.

In addition to events at our own camp Glazier, we are usually invited to two or three events at other locations.
